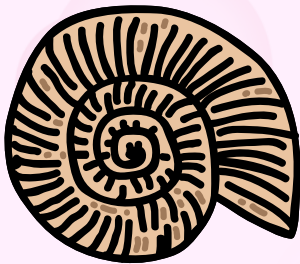

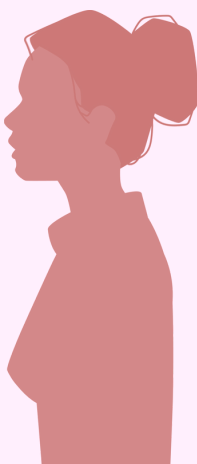


Lakeshore Fossil Hunting

Girl Scouts hunt for fossils along the shore of Lake Michigan and discover clues to Wisconsin's past! Get a brief introduction to the types of fossils we might find before walking to the lakeside fossil collection area at Eichelman Park Beach. **\$10 per Girl Scout**

Artistic Adventures

Choose an artistic exploration in printmaking, still life painting, or polymer clay. A curator will introduce the project, show technique, and assist Girl Scouts as they work on their own designs. Each Girl Scout will leave with a finished piece of artwork. **\$20 per Girl Scout**
