Every program will involve meeting some of our animal ambassadors in person. Full programs with indoor and outdoor components are approximately 90 minutes long, with shorter versions available upon request.

# ECO LEARNER DAISIES

In this program we learn about how the Wildlife in Need Center helps the animals that live right here in Wisconsin. Not only that-but we can meet some of them in person! We will also discuss how anyone can help protect wildlife and their habitats. Finally we will head outside and explore our own local environment



# OUTDOOR ART MAKER DAISIES

Stripes on a skunk, swirls on a turtle shell, meet some animals who are walking art projects! We will learn about an environmental artist as well before we go outside and practice seeing and creating art in nature.

#### MATH IN NATURE 1: SHAPES IN NATURE DAISIES

This program begins with an introduction to an environmental artist who sees all sorts of shapes and patterns in nature. We will meet some animals and notice the shapes and patterns they have and why they might look the way they do. Then we will go outside and practice describing the world around us. Finally we will use these skills to make our own nature art.

### BUGS BROWNIES

Why are bugs important? What bugs live around me? In this program we meet some animals that need bugs to survive. We will also make some bug art and go outside to catch the bugs living right in the WINC's
