Totally fun. Totally you.

You, your troop, and your Girl Scout sisters—dreaming up adventures, making the whole world sparkle with your own personal brand of magic, and creating forever friends and lifetime memories. Above all else, you're having a blast—because you know bringing the fun is all about being your true selves, trying new things, and cheering each other on. Get ready to have fun, learn cool new skills, and bring a bit more happy to your life.

- Events are offered in-person or virtually.
- Events are a great way to start or complete requirements for an earned award.
- Events are facilitated by staff, volunteers, community partners, and/or Girl Scouts (under supervision).
- All GSWISE-sponsored events are fun, interactive, educational, held to the highest safety standards, and developed to meet the needs of all members.
- Some events require that chaperones register for the event and accompany Girl Scouts during the event. These events are indicated with the chaperone  symbol.
- Some events are appropriate for the whole family, including siblings. Look for the family  symbol.

Event Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available to help members participate in Girl Scout events. Financial assistance can be considered for one event per season (fall, spring, summer) per Girl Scout when GSWISE hosts the event registration.

Financial assistance may not be available for partner events.

To request event financial assistance, select the Financial Assistance box during online registration. A Financial Assistance Form will be emailed to the family to complete and submit. Financial assistance is funded by proceeds from the Girl Scout Cookie Program and gifts to Girl Scouting.

Program Activity Credits (PACs)

Girl Scouts earn PACs by participating in the Girl Scout Fall Product and Cookie Programs. Credits can be used to pay for all or partial event fees when GSWISE hosts the event registration. To redeem PACs, select “Program Credits” as your payment method during online registration. A PAC Form will be emailed to the family to complete and submit.

- Overnight event registration closes two weeks before the event.
- Day events close either one week or two days before the event.

Confirmations and Recognitions

Event confirmation details are available at gswise.org>*MYGS*>*My Events*>*Upcoming Events* two weeks prior to the event. Share the event confirmation with everyone registered from your group.

Event descriptions indicate when Girl Scouts are working toward or earning an award at an event. Award patches are available for purchase at your local Girl Scout Resource Center, or contact us at 800-565-4475 or customercare@gswise.org to coordinate patch purchase with mailing/delivery options. It is noted in the event description when participation patches are included with the event registration.

Program Aides (PA)

Girl Scouts in grades 6-12 can strengthen their leadership skills, channel their confidence, and work directly with younger Girl Scouts as a Program Aide! They can assist at events and lead activities to turn their goals into reality.

- How PAs register:
 - Go to gswise.org>*MYGS*>*Find Events*.
 - Find events that interest you where you are at least two years older than the event participants.
 - Find the event name with “PA” in front of it and use that link to complete your registration. PAs do not pay a registration fee.
- Attend PA Core Training. Training is not required but is very helpful. Find PA trainings at gswise.org>*MYGS*>*Find Events* or on page 15.

Adult Volunteers/Chaperones

Adults chaperoning Girl Scouts other than their daughter are required to be registered with Girl Scouts of the USA as an adult member. Safety is our number one priority. We can prioritize the safety of all Girl Scouts and Girl Scout volunteers only when adults become registered members and complete the required background check.

Adult volunteers are responsible for obtaining permission slips and for meeting adult-to-Girl Scout ratios for the event. All attending adults are expected to assist the Girl Scout(s) as needed and to prioritize appropriate Girl Scout behavior.

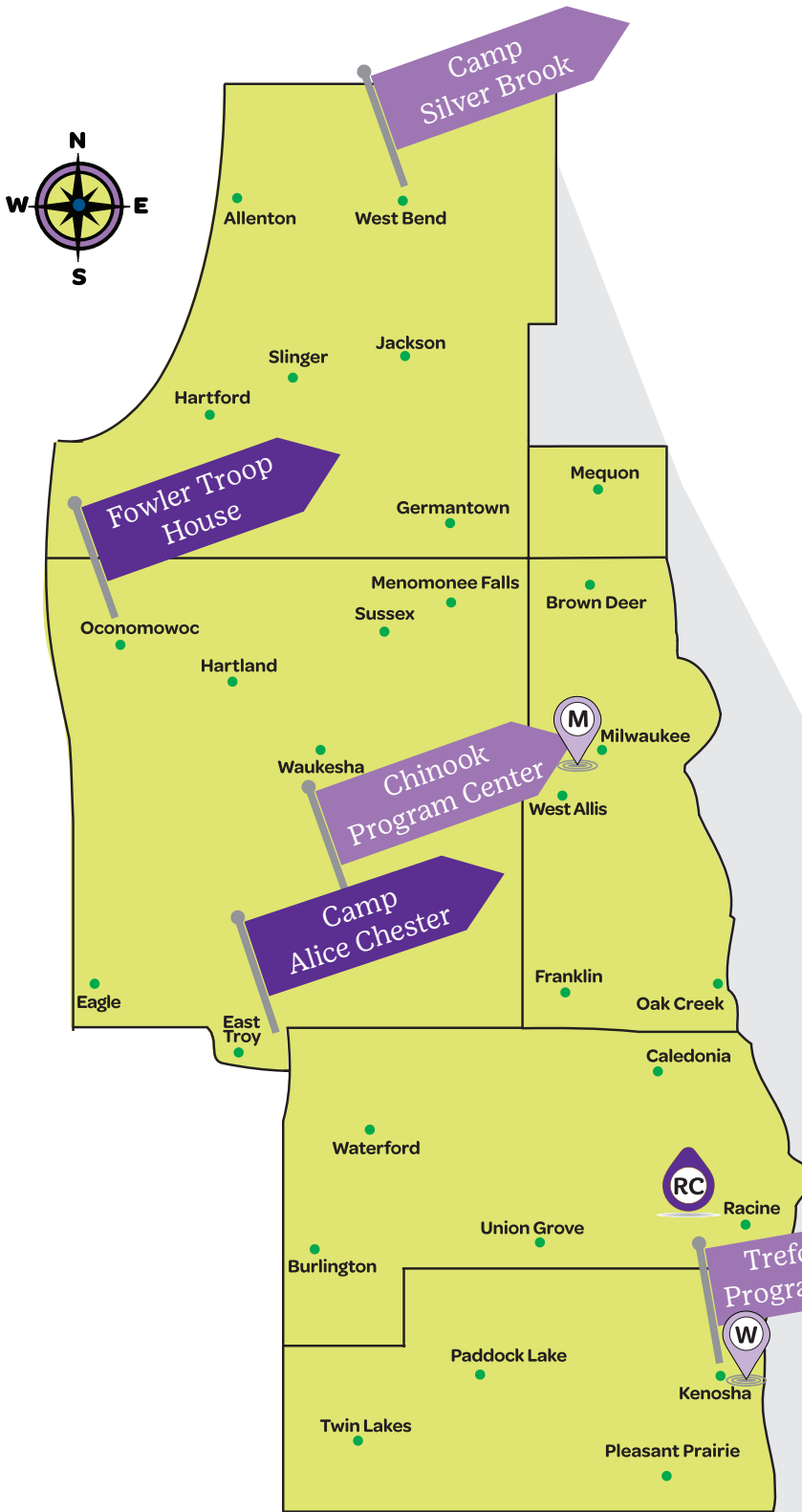
Event Cancellations Policy

Cancellations are available when requested more than two weeks ahead of an event when GSWISE hosts the event registration. A \$5 cancellation processing fee will be incurred for each registrant for events with fees \$5 and higher. Refunds are not available when canceling within two weeks of the event. Cancellations might not be available for some partner events. If you would like to change the event or date, please register and pay for the new session and contact us at 800-565-4475 or customercare@gswise.org to process a cancellation. If the event is canceled by the council, full refunds will be issued. Refunds should be received within two weeks from when the cancellation was processed.

Learn about Being Good Friends with People of All Kinds of Minds!

New!

Did you know that almost 40% of girls are neurodivergent? Neurodiversity is the idea that we all have different brain wiring. If you don't have a diagnosable brain-based difference, such as autism, you are part of the "neuromajority" or are considered "neurotypical." Maybe your troop reflects as neurodiverse, and you want to know better how to knit these girls together. Troop leaders and parents/guardians are invited to join us for an informational session where Good Friend, Inc. will introduce the language of neurodiversity and share pointers on fostering empathy, acceptance, and neurodiverse friendships. This is a hybrid session so participants can choose to participate in-person or virtually. This program is made possible by the Women and Girls Fund of Waukesha County.

Red Cross First Aid & CPR/AED Training for Volunteers

This Red Cross course contains step-by-step, hands-on training that allows participants to respond effectively in emergency and life-threatening situations. For more information on First Aid/CPR, check out [Volunteer Essentials](#).

Who should attend: At least one registered adult who accompanies a troop on activities or overnight trips must be certified in first aid and CPR. (Registration will open to Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors two weeks prior to training date if capacity allows.)

Note:

- A **four-hour online portion of this training is required prior to attending the scheduled in-person training**. The link can be found in your confirmation document in your MyGS account.
- **If you hold a current Red Cross certification** and you need to renew, you may provide proof of your current Red Cross certification in lieu of the four-hour online training.
- You will be **required to demonstrate at least one two-minute cycle of CPR performed on the floor to be certified**. If you're unable to meet this requirement, you may attend the class, but will not be certified and will not be able to count as the certified volunteer for your troop.

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

New!

Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches participants how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among adolescents. In this course, you'll build the skills and confidence you need to reach out and provide initial support to young people who are struggling. You'll also learn how to help connect them with appropriate support.

After this course, participants will be able to:

- Recognize common signs and symptoms of mental health challenges, including anxiety, depression, eating disorders, and attention deficit hyperactive disorder (ADHD).
- Recognize common signs and symptoms of substance use challenges.
- Understand how to interact with a young person in crisis.
- Know how to connect a young person with help.
- Better understand trauma, substance use, self-care, and the impact of social media and bullying.

Who should attend: Anyone who interacts with young people on a regular basis, in any capacity. This training is open to all member and non-member adults 18 years of age or older.

This course requires a short online assessment to better understand where students are starting from before attending the in-person course.

Outdoor Skills Trainings

To build and cook over a campfire with your Girl Scouts, at least one adult from a troop must have completed either in-person Outdoor Skills training or online Fire Safety and Outdoor Cooking Training. If you have extensive knowledge of Girl Scout procedures for building and cooking over a campfire, you can complete an exemption quiz in gsLearn instead.

Outdoor Skills In-Person Training

Learn the basic outdoor skills to take your troop camping or volunteer at day camp. As you go through the session, you will follow the same techniques you'll use to teach your Girl Scouts how to do a flag ceremony, use knives safely, build a campfire, and cook their own meals and clean their dishes properly. You'll enjoy a tasty lunch you help prepare!

Learn what it means to have a differently-wired brain, how that might change what friendship looks like, and how you can lead the way by being an UPstander if you see bullying, which is a problem for so many children with autism and other brain-based differences. Girl Scouts going for the Gold must receive council approval at two occasions: first, prior to starting the project and second, after project completion.

- To obtain first project approval, Girl Scouts must submit their Proposal in GoGold at least three weeks prior to the tentative start date of the project.
- To obtain second project approval, Girl Scouts must submit their Final Report in GoGold after project completion (final deadline is September 30 after they graduate high school).

Upon submission of the Proposal or Final Report, the council will connect the Girl Scout with a representative from the Highest Awards Mentor Committee. Girl Scouts will correspond with the committee member to gain council approval through email, text messages, phone calls, video calls, and/or in-person meetings. If you wish to connect with the Highest Awards Mentor Committee prior to submitting a Project Proposal, simply contact Customer Care at 800-565-4475 or customercare@gswise.org to be connected earlier in the process.

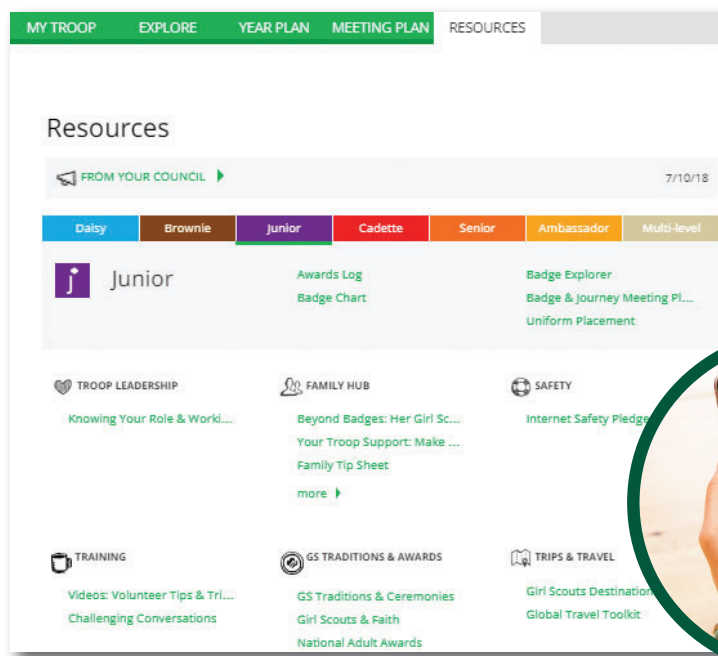
